## MAINTENANCE PROJECTS

Spa Cover



The long-awaited Spa Cover is finally here, and it looks great. The first one came with some errors in construction, but Hot Tub Works has rebuilt the entire cover correctly and shipped it to us, all for no additional charge. ## Landscaping changes/Update

At the end of the busy summer/fall season last year, you may have seen Christine Savage of Greenscapes Property Services out on the grounds. We have enlisted her help again this year to help map, re-work, and fine tune our irrigation systems. Also new this year, the Landscaping team will be implementing a structured rotational schedule to be sure that all areas get the attention needed.

### Other Maintenance Projects

Another major project planned for this summer is more replacement of the old steel waterline with 2" HDPE, the current industry standard. This year we will replace the lines from Unit 13 through 20. Fortunately, those lines are under landscaping and grassy meadow areas which will not require replacement of pavement. We anticipate beginning this work May 1, with completion set for June 1. In 2021 we plan to do Units 9-12 and the Yacht Club. Then, all that will remain for that project will be the Office, Maintenance Garage, Aspen House, and Units 21 and 22. We hope to finish those areas in 2022.

### Harbor Issues





Many Lake Tahoe marinas sustained damages in the hellacious winds of February 9, including Fleur du Lac, where we incurred some significant damage to the outer sheet pile at our Boathouse Jetty. Lane and Ed are in the process of assessing damages and getting bids from three local companies (Tahoe Marine & Excavation's Matt Daniels, Pacific Built and Ginsberg Excavation).

### Maintenance Shop

The Stuarts have opted to spend the winter with us here at Fleur du Lac, their first winter since they bought their unit! While here, Doug has been very generous with his time, helping with many tasks throughout the property. While cleaning and organizing the Maintenance Shop, Doug noticed that the elevated storage area needed attention. The floor is sagging under the weight of items stored, and access to the area is insufficient.

This project under was already consideration by The Board. The Board has enlisted the services of Engineer Tim Ferrell to get the process going. The drawings are being created now; as soon as they are completed, there are several contractors willing to bid the project, to be undertaken as soon as possible this spring. This should increase storage and mobility in the shop, making for more efficient use of the space available and eliminating any safety hazards. Thank you, Doug, for all your help!

### Furry Neighbors

We all know that critters are a part of life. At the end of summer last year, there was some damage done to Stewart Koch's boat which was attributed to muskrats. To curtail this activity, Doug Stuart volunteered the use of and set up a motion-activated-camera at the location of a trap that Ed set to try to capture the wily critter. (It helps to know just what varmints we have, so we know what to bait our trap with.) Ed noticed the scat in the area has changed in appearance since this effort began. Perhaps a mink or an ermine has eaten the muskrat! To date, the camera has only caught the investigatory efforts of our stealthy mascot, Elwood! As soon as True Service can access them, the vole traps will be re-baited, and bat deterrent will be put up early in the spring before the bats can begin nesting activities.

# THINGS TO SEE AND DO

#### Surfing Lake Tahoe Anyone?

You must ask yourself ~ Really, where else can you surf in the morning and ski or snowboard on the same day? For those cold weather adrenaline-junkies, Tahoe is the place (plus, here you can get a little taste of the wind/wave action that did the damage at the Marina on February 9<sup>th</sup>)! <u>Surf's Up!</u> Garwoods January 9, 2020.

If that's not enough fun, then check this out. It's been around for a while and is a great option when the snowpack is minimal and temperatures have been low enough to keep it firm: Fat Bikes. Not enough snow? Go ride a bike! Tahoe Donner Cross Country, Northstar California, and Kirkwood Mountain Resort allow Fat Bikes (Mountain Bikes with minimum 4" wide soft pressure tires for gripping softer surfaces). Fat Bikes originally invented in the late 1980's for riding the Iditarod Trail in winter, and they have become another way to get out there, get a work-out, and soak up some Tahoe! Crab & Pasta Feed, March 21: All-youcan-eat Dungeness Crab anyone? Then, look into this annual fundraiser put on by the <u>Rotary Club of Truckee</u> that benefits a different local Non-Profit each year. This year's recipient will be the Contractors Association of Truckee Tahoe (CATT) who will do the work to convert an outdated playground into an ADA-accessible picnic area, amphitheater, sensory garden, and a more organic play area.
