# PROJECTS & PROGRESS

## ROOFING & RAFTER TAILS



Jay Lebel and his Roofing crew got a late start due to the relentless rainstorms, pushing their start date back a full month to the beginning of June. Nonetheless, they pushed hard to get Units 9 & 10 done in record time and did a wonderful job keeping the area clean and tidy and looking good. Thank You, Jay!

Dave Johnson and his team from Timbercraft Construction worked wonders on the restoration of the beams and rafter tails at the Yacht Club and Units 19 & 20. There are many yet to be done but the hope is to resurrect a few each summer season to whittle

down the magnitude of the project and ensure that repairs are done properly to curtail further damage from the elements.

#### **NEW SERVICE ROAD**

After many months of planning and reconfiguring, our improved service road project has taken shape. Passing approval by the Board as well as the TRPA and keeping within our desired coverage allowance, the road finally went in the first week of October. The old road will be restored and revegetated.

This improvement will mean that our machinery, tools, work vehicles, and materials storage, as well as the dumpster, will now be out of sight. It will also provide a more efficient and out-of-the-way workspace for projects-in-progress.

# IRRIGATION & FIRE SUPPRESSION

Early this summer, we learned that a controller for our Fire Suppression System (the irrigation system is tied into this plumbing) had burned out and needed to be replaced. Finding the replacement part proved to be quite a chore as it

is considered obsolete. Ed was to finally able find replacement for around \$300 rather than replacing the entire unit for \$20,000! The even bigger surprise was when the installation was complete and they were testing the system. A previously unknown and unnecessary valve buried deep beneath the roadway near Unit #5 blew out, creating an enormous five-foot deep hole and the need for everyone to scurry madly about to get the repair made lest the newly planted areas dry up and die. Repairs were made quickly but this episode further reinforced the knowledge that the entire system is in need of more detailed investigation and upgrades going forward.

#### SIGNS

We've had reports of fewer trespassers from Grand Ave. after new "No Trespassing" signs were installed notifying the public of the high water demarcation at the North end of our beach and along the waterfront. "Private Marina" signs will be added at the Harbor entrance soon.
