






Fleur du Lac contracted with Pacific Built to replace the rotten piling on the South Jetty. The Board decided to combine the South Jetty work with the remaining Boat House piling work as a cost saving measure; that way FDL would not need to pay the equipment and barge mobilization fees twice.

The permits were delayed by the government agencies this spring. We finally received permits in mid-April for the lake-disturbing work that needed to be completed by April 30.



Pacific Built worked around the clock to meet the April 30 deadline. They were then able to finish the additional non-lakedisturbing work by June 1.

After replacing and reconfiguring the docks, FDL homeowners can now bring boats to the South Jetty.

Greenscapes will be executing their three contracts for Spring Debris Clean-up, Weekly Mow & Blow, and fine gardening for beds, edging, and pruning.

Lane will be supporting David in his efforts to organize and structure our "To Do" lists and daily project prioritization as well as documenting the processes and systems we have on our property today. Lane is a very valuable member of our staff and we look forward to her continued involvement.

Hansen Management Co has extensive experience and contacts with vendors in the Tahoe Basin and, due to its scale, is able to get good responses when service is needed. Below is some background on Hansen Management. Hansen Management has been responsible for the Maintenance, Management, Recreation, and Security services at the Tahoe Tavern, Tavern Shores, Chambers Landing, and the Chambers Landing Recreation Associations for the last 34-37 years. They have also assumed the same responsibilities at Star Harbor, Water's Edge, Homewood Shores, Tahoe Boat Company, Cedar Point, and the Cedar Flat Improvement Association during the last 21 years. Hansen will utilize a Microsoft Access database system to track ongoing tasks with an eye toward not allowing pending tasks to "fall through the cracks", and employees will convene every Thursday morning to monitor progress on all punch list items.

Hansen's services will also include budget preparation, long-range repairs and replacement studies, Board Meeting preparation, monitoring contractors and requests for project proposal preparation. The team will also be scanning all historical documents that would be useful going forward and organizing our data so it can be easily accessed when needed. We will be transferring more of the accounts payable and receivable functions to our accounting firm, and HR management will be conducted by Hansen Management. Current FDL employees will remain employees of FDL for now. Hansen Management looks forward to providing services to the FDL community. 
