Record Breaking Snowfall 2023

Last year's (2022) survey was pitifully low. Water officials had just a small patch of shallow snow to measure after a disappointing winter. The snow depth on April 2 was just 2.5 inches - part of a disastrous multiyear dry spell that triggered water cuts across the state. But what a difference a year makes. Record snowpack, nearly full reservoirs. Here's the state of California's drought after an epic winter twelve months later: the mountains are now loaded with white gold. South of Lake Tahoe at Phillips Station, as snowflakes fell from the surrounding hills, officials measured a snow depth of 126.5 inches and a snow water equivalent - how much liquid water the snow holds - of 54 inches. Snowpack in the California Sierra is 221% of normal for this location at this time of year, officials at the Department of Water Resources said. Statewide, snowpack is averaging 237% compared to normal for the date. Sean de Guzman, snow survey manager for the state Department of Water Resources, said this is the deepest snowpack he has personally ever measured, noting that there have only been three other years in recorded history when California snowpack has been greater than 200% of average in April. "This year is going to join that list and be another year well above 200% of average".

Spring Skiing

Typically, resorts close up shop by mid April. This year, however, several have extended their seasons — in some cases by several weeks.

Keep in mind that lift ticket prices change in the spring and some ski areas offer special deals and discounts. Some resorts will throw in spring skiing access this year when you buy a season pass for next winter. Also, resorts encourage people to buy their day tickets online in advance.

Here's the full list of closing dates for Tahoe resorts:

Palisades Tahoe, Olympic Valley: open through April 30,
then on a reduced schedule through May

Palisades Tahoe, Alpine Meadows: open through April 30,
then on a reduced schedule through July 4

Sugar Bowl: open through April 23, then the weekend of
April 29-30

Boreal: open through April 16
Northstar: open through April 16, then weekends through
April 30

Mt. Rose: open through April 23
Diamond Peak: open through May 1
Homewood: open through April 9
Heavenly: open through May 7

Sierra-at-Tahoe: open through April 23, with a special "Customer Appreciation Day" of partial lift operations on April 24

Kirkwood: open through April 30, then weekends through May 14

Note: In spring, ski areas often systematically shut down parts of their mountains, change operating hours, or opt to open only on weekends. Check each resort's website for details.
